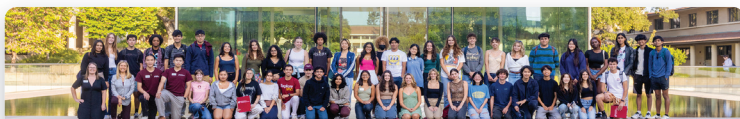

CMC'S GOULD CENTER EARNS NATIONAL HONOR

The Gould Center's Humanities Labs at Claremont McKenna College have been awarded The Prize for Excellence and Innovation in Philosophy Programs from the American Philosophical Association and Philosophy Documentation Center.

The national honor recognizes the creation of programs that "risk undertaking new initiatives in philosophy, and do so with excellence and success ... so they may inspire and influence others to follow their lead."

"Based on student testimonials, we at the Gould Center have long been confident that we've hit upon a winning formula with our signature initiatives like the Humanities Labs. But it's really incredibly gratifying and rewarding to get this external validation and recognition of our success," said Amy Kind, Director of the Gould Center and Russell K. Pitzer Professor of Philosophy.

The award selection committee specifically cited the Humanities Labs for fostering a "ground-breaking approach to philosophical scholarship and pedagogy by building on the team-based model familiar from scientific research."

POMONA COLLEGE ALUMNA NAMED NCAA WOMAN OF THE YEAR

Alexandra Turvey began her four years at Pomona College remotely in 2020, confined to Zoom at the outset of the pandemic. But even from her Vancouver bedroom, she could tell how special Pomona was by the eagerness of her classmates to create a community despite being scattered across the world.

Once on campus, the biology major blazed a trail as a Sagehen student-athlete, receiving 21 All-American honors as a swimmer and amassing 2,500 hours of science and clinical research. In January, Turvey was named NCAA Woman of the Year, winning over athletes from the association's three divisions. She is the first Pomona alumna to receive the honor—which recognizes graduating student-athletes who've displayed excellence in academics, leadership and community service.

"This award truly means the world to me," Turvey says, "but what is even more special to me is that it gives recognition to Pomona and what a world-class place it is to be a student-athlete."

Turvey graduated Pomona in 2024 and is now pursuing graduate studies in the Harvard/MIT MD-PhD program. She remains thankful to her Pomona professors, friends and fellow Sagehens for creating a safe and uplifting space for her to thrive.

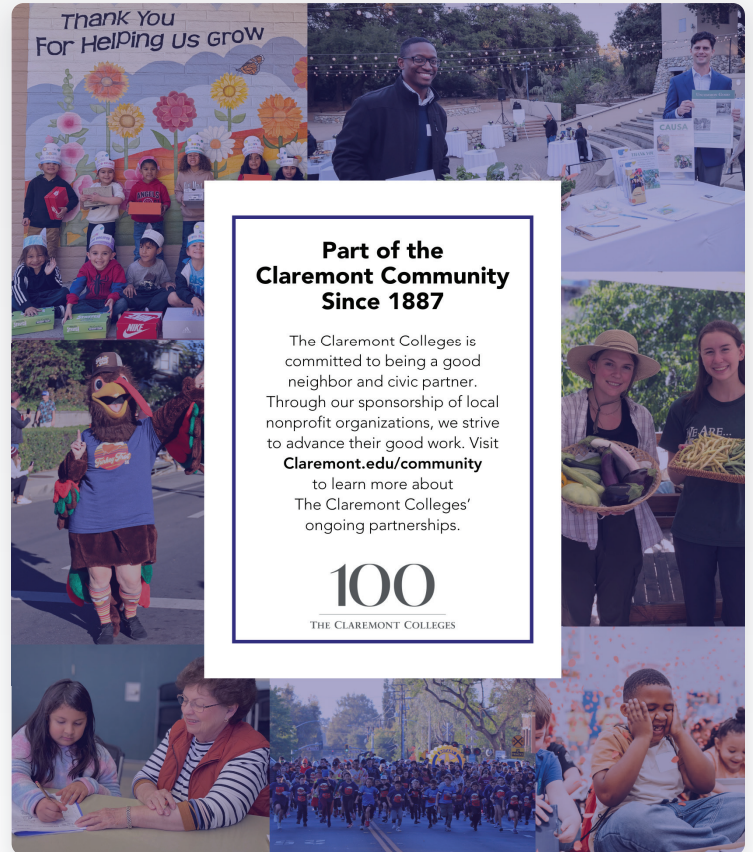
